## MESSAGE FROM THE COMMODORE

---



Aloha members and friends,

Our first general membership dinner meeting went very well. We served over fifty dinners and welcomed six new members. As you know, increasing membership is my biggest goal for the year. One of my ideas to bring in new members is to build a new launching dock to be used by junior sailors, paddlers, kayakers, and stand-up paddlers. I have worked with watersports people to pencil out possible member numbers and it looks very promising. It is also a desirable amenity for our current members, who have inquired over the years about the possibility. We have a draft plan already and the cost is just under \$50,000. We've had \$11,000 donated to us through boat sales. Anyone interested in donating for the cause, or anyone with ideas to help raise the funds, please see Scott Melander or me.

My first month at the helm has been a little "choppy," with implementation of new initiatives slowed a bit with some plumbing issues in the bar and some computer server problems. The plumbing has been temporarily repaired and we're trying out a new computer system which we hope will help expedite transactions at the bar.

Other initiatives have proceeded apace. The strategic planning committee met twice in January. The BOG and the Bylaws Committee are working on bringing our Bylaws current. The HYC sailing season has added a Lahaina feeder race.

February's membership meeting is the 18th with dinner being served by RSVP. Please join us and bring ideas to share with your fellow members.

I look forward to seeing you all around the club. Wishing you all fair winds and calm seas.



# SAILING REPORT

---

Buy a Boat, Go Sailing

Ahoy Sailors and Friends,

We are on a beam reach toward the startline for HYC's 2020 sailing season with our Koko Head Race on 23 February. So what's holding you back from jumping onboard and grabbing a sheet? Don't have a boat, you say? Well then, you should BUY A BOAT AND GO SAILING. Now, I can hear your response already: "Whaaat? Buying a boat is the worst investment possible." Well, I say it's all in your perspective. Maybe boats don't appreciate in monetary value but they offer so much more. They were able to see their children sail and also got to enjoy a pod of spinner dolphins. I think the dolphins were the biggest hit of the day! Congratulations to Dylan Schiff for placing second in Laser B and Noe Velasco for placing third.

We sailed in Kaneohe last weekend (January 25-26, 2020) in the Hawaii Youth Sailing Association El Toro Clinic. The weather was great with 10-12 knot tradewinds and flat water on the bay. Cyrus Howell, Jillian Simpson, Juliet Cramer, Addie Ruiz, Dyland Schiff, and Erika Torres sailed in the two-day event. Sailors practiced boat handling, boat speed, and racing strategies. There was great improvement especially with rounding the leeward mark in a single file line. There were about 22 boats in the fleet, so that made for crowded mark roundings.

Coming up we have laser races on February 8 and 16, 2020 in Kaneohe Bay and Hickam Harbor, respectively. Our high school sailing programs begin on Monday February 3, 2020. Students from Sacred Hearts Academy, St Andrews Priory, and Kamehameha Schools will be practicing Monday thru Thursday from 4:00 pm to 6:30 pm. The teams practice during February and March, and then participate in regattas in April. We also have our spring program beginning Saturday, February 15, 2020 with novice/intermediate sailors in the morning from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm, followed by racing from 1:00 pm to 4: pm. Adults are welcome to join us in the morning.

# Wahine Sailing Series 2020

The Wahine Sailing Series is implementing a “learning and growth” aspect to our season this year. We’ve been greatly impressed with the caliber of women who get out on the water in our series and wish to assist wahine sailors who are new to sailing/racing.

Our schedule this year includes the following regattas, with a brief description of the format of the day:

~ *limited on-water coaching*
- Feb 29, 2020 – PYC RS Quest  
~ *Morning clinic/Afternoon racing*
- Mar 22, 2020 – KYC IRF Invitational  
~ *“TBA” Boat Handling/Racing Clinic on Mar 21*
- Apr 18, 2020 – PHYC Laser  
~ *Morning clinic/Afternoon racing*
- May 16, 2020 – HYC Sweetheart Big Boat Regatta  
~ *“Take a new crew”*
- Jul 19, 2020 – WYC Cal 20 Invitational  
~ *Post-race “share & learn”*
- Aug 16, 2020 – KYC Cal 20  
~ *Post-race “share & learn”*
- Oct 24, 2020– WYC Pau Big Boat End of Season  
~ *“Take a new crew”*

2020 series enhancements:

- ~ The Dinghy Regattas will have clinic/coaching components in the day.
- ~ The Big Boat Regattas: we ask that boats take on novice wahine crew.
- ~ The Cal 20 Regattas will include a post-race sharing & learning huddle.

As always, we will be asking our race committees to hold a 4th “crew” race. This race is not scored and it’s an opportunity for less-experienced crew to take the helm without the pressure of a scored race. Perhaps, with this focus for 2020, we may see more crew willing and eager to participate in the 4th race--winds permitting, of course!

Two of our regattas have taken a different form this year: We get to sail PYC’s new fleet of RS Quests, and we have a single-hand regatta in Lasers at PHYC.

We continue to do all we can to assist new, or recently inactive sailors, in making connections with skippers, crews, owners, and members of our community. With our, “take-a-new-crew” request for the big boat regattas, this practice may become even easier.

## Wahine Sailing Series 2020 cont.

We've had the fortune of three new members joining our steering committee: Becca Hoskins from PYC; Olivia Lowinthian from PHYC; and Sharon Billingsley from KYC. All three of these women bring wonderful new energy to our racing series. Each of us brings what we can when we can, and we are always open to interested members of our community joining us in organizing this fun series.

The North Sails Perpetual Wahine Skipper of the Year trophy was deeded in 1997 upon request from Ashley and Marvin Lee. Historically, yacht clubs included a "female skipper" race in their schedule. In the 1990s there was a strong community of very talented women sailors who formed Hawaii Women's Yacht Racing Association (HWYRA). HWYRA managed the awarding of the trophy until the association dwindled away and female-skipped races disappeared from the calendar. When there were no female-skipped races in the 2009 season, I asked fellow wahine sailors from the five major yacht clubs and HYRA to join me in getting wahine-skipped races back on the 2010 calendar. We've purposefully limited the growth of the series by including only two wahine regattas each year.

Our 2020 Season Opener on FJs, hosted by Andy Johnson & the UH sailing team, saw nine boats on the water, four of them with non-UH sailors. It was a great day with good breeze and close racing, especially in the last race. We had five wahine who were first-time participants of our series, and a four-way tie going into the third race!

Congratulations to our top three finishers of the day:

1. Hayden Lahr and Izzy Anderson
